



BYE - LAWS .

made by the Local Board for the District
of Nuneaton acting as the Urban
Sanitary Authority
with respect to

THE CLEANSING OF FOOTWAYS AND PAVEMENTS in the
Urban Sanitary District of Nuneaton.

The cleansing of footways and pavements adjoining any
premises.

1. The occupier of any premises fronting, adjoining, or
abutting on any street shall, once at least in every day,
Sundays excepted, cleanse the footways and pavements adjoining
such premises.

PENALTIES.

2. Every person who shall offend against the foregoing bye-
law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty of
five pounds.


Provided nevertheless, that the justices or court be-
fore whom any complaint may be made or any proceedings may be
taken in respect of any such offence may, if they think
fit, adjudge the payment as a penalty of any sum less than
the full amount of the penalty imposed by this bye-law.

REPEAL OF BYE-LAWS.


3. From and after the date of the ^{confirmation} completion of these
Byelaws the Byelaws, relating to footways and cleansing of
Privies, which were confirmed on the twelfth day of May, in
the year, One thousand eight hundred and fifty nine by one
of her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State shall be re-
pealed.

The foregoing Bye-laws were adopted at a
meeting of the Local Board, in the district of Gloucester
acting as the urban Sanitary Authority held on the
10th day of January 1893.
