RECORD OF THE DECISION

- a) The issue
 - 1) To appoint a competent steel contractor to undertake remedial works at the Pingles Leisure Centre, due to steel column corrosion within the leisure water area.
- b) The Decision

To approve the appointment of Owen Fabrications LTD and enter into contract for them to deliver the required steel remedial work at the Pingles Leisure Centre.

REASON FOR THE DECISION

The decision is required to expeditiously address the identified H&S / structural issues at the Pingles Leisure Centre. It is also important that we act quickly to return the service back to residents and reduce NBBC exposure as much as possible to Loss of Income Claims from its Leisure Operator.

NBBC needs to appoint a contractor following a Structural Engineers report on corroded steel columns, supporting the roof and extended health & fitness mezzanine gym floor.

Due to H&S, the leisure water area and extended gym floor are currently closed and require addressing expeditiously to address these concerns. Initially with a temporary solution and following an ultrasound test undertake final remedial works required.

ALTERNATIVE OPTIONS CONSIDERED AND REJECTED IN MAKING THE DECISION

The Council to enter a full procurement process, which will delay delivery timescales.
