

NUNEATON AND BEDWORTH BOROUGH COUNCIL KEY DECISIONS: GENERAL EXCEPTION PUBLIC NOTICE

The report requests approval from cabinet to allocate the 1.5m between our two key town centres based on population with 60% of the funding been allocated to Nuneaton and 40% to Bedworth. The first £750,000 will be allocated to NBBC in this financial year, as such it is important that we get the agreement for the split in the available funds agreed at the earliest opportunity to ensure consultation can take place on priority projects and detailed costing be determined.
