## RECORD OF THE DECISION

### a) The Issue

Due to issues with recruitment of directly employed qualified surveying personnel, additional external provision is required for commercial property valuation and surveying services by the Land and property team.

### b) The Decision

To approve use of a using a framework agreement and to procure and enter a call-off contract for the provision of property valuation services and surveying services to support Land & Property team for a period of 3 years.

## REASON FOR THE DECISION

Lack of qualified personnel is creating capacity issues for the Land & Property. Due to issues with recruitment of directly employed qualified surveying personnel, additional external provision is required for commercial property valuation and surveying services by the Land and property team.

Budget allocated to general fund for external surveying services and valuation accounted for.

## ALTERNATIVE OPTIONS CONSIDERED AND REJECTED IN MAKING THE DECISION

To continue to try and recruit qualified surveyors, the post and JD have been amended and grade increase and readvertised serval times without success.

Temporary agency staff have been employed but the cost implications are not sustainable in the long-term.

Outsource of service consequently the preferred and most cost-effective option using available public sector framework to ensure best value and competency.
