9. Outline of Applicants Case

Appearing remotely as outlined above:
Restaurant and has table service and alcohol drink in or deliver to house.
Food is delivered themselves, not through third parties such as Uber Eats. They will be trained to Challenge 25. Already been doing for 10 years with other branch and want to do at this branch. 10 years, no issues.
Without food, cannot order alcohol. Applicant advises that he knows how to serve alcohol as he has been doing it for so long.
Never gives alcohol to walk away with – only table service.

Sub Committee Q's:

Cllr Bird – Premises currently is a restaurant.

A - Yes

Cllr - Sell alcohol currently?

A - No at old store they sell, but not currently.

Cllr Bird – As part of the Application want to sell in the restaurant and sell alcohol to deliver to home. On off sales, if called to order food and alcohol, how would you ensure that you were selling to a person of the correct age.

Applicant – Drivers trained to ask for ID at door. If not provided, the alcohol is sent back. Using Challenge 25

Cllr Bird – if make an order, do I prepay for that?

Applicant – if alcohol is returned then it will be refunded.

Cllr King – You have a restaurant, you do not currently sell alcohol with meals a the moment.

A - No

Cllr – how long have you had it?

A- Opened in January

Cllr - Previous business had licenses?

A - Yes

Cllr - Big in the news right, selling alcohol for delivery is bad for alcoholics. How would you monitor that?

A - Drivers will review whether the recipient is drunk, the alcohol will be refused and brought back.

Cllr - How do you see this as profitable compared to supermarkets?

A - Having the alcohol brings more people to the business.

Cllr Croft – confirming the license – is it purely a home delivery service or is it a takeaway service also?

Applicant – In takeaway, you cannot buy alcohol only for home deliveries (has to be alongside food order) and in the restaurant.

Cllr Bird – alcohol will only be ancillary to food?

Applicant – yes – with food only.

Interested parties Q's:

Cllr Walsh – Business moved from Mill Street to Congreve walk – previously was doing delivery of food and alcohol. What was the situation re the license.

Applicant – We had a licence.

Cllr Walsh – please can we confirm

Ricky confirmed that this application was in place.

Interested parties: N/A

Applicant:

Never had a problem with the previous licence, no issues. Need the licence to increase the business.

16. Decision

Application granted subject to the following conditions:

- Sales of alcohol, for consumption off the premises, to be purchased with food and made by delivery only.

17. Reason

In coming to its decision, the Sub-Committee had regard to the oral and written submissions received from the Applicant and the Interested Parties, the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy and the Guidance issued by the Secretary of State and feels that there is not sufficient expectation to believe that if the application was approved, there would be a cumulative impact on the area resulting in unacceptable anti-social behaviour or public nuisance which would undermine the licensing objectives.

There was a void of representations from responsible authorities to support any resident concerns and considered that the evidence of the steps to be taken to comply with the objectives was adequate.

There is a robust enforcement procedure for licensing complaints and there will be an ongoing responsibility to support all licensing objectives with the option of calling for a licence review.
