Item

- A further objection has been received since the publication of the agenda from Councillor Kondakor objecting to the development and raising the following summarised points:-
 - 1. Concerns that sewage generated by the development will add to the existing problems of sewage being pumped into water courses.
 - 2. A request has also been made that the sewage pumping station is conditioned so that it has capacity to pause pumping sewage in to the system during a major rainfall event and a short period afterward so that sewage from this site is not washed into water courses.

Six further resident objections have been received raising the following summarised points:-

- 1. The increase in volume of traffic would be dangerous
- 2. Impact on air quality
- 3. Local schools, doctors, dentists etc are already over-prescribed
- 4. Insufficient parking in the village
- 5. Loss of privacy and light
- 6. Increase in anti-social behaviour
- 7. Construction process may damage existing properties
- 8. Housing requirement forcast is incorrect and HS7 is to be removed from the updated Borough Plan
- 9. Green fields are erquired for wellbeing, mental health and food security.
- 10. Brownfield sites should be used first
- 11. Discrepencies within supporting statements
- 12. Residents were informed that Bramcote Close would not be used as an acess as it is not wide enough and an incorrect specification
- 13. Firleigh Drive is privately owned
- 14. Traffic has already increased since the surveys
- 15. Consultation should have extended wider
- 16. Impacts to nature, conservation, trees, biodiversity and environmental health
