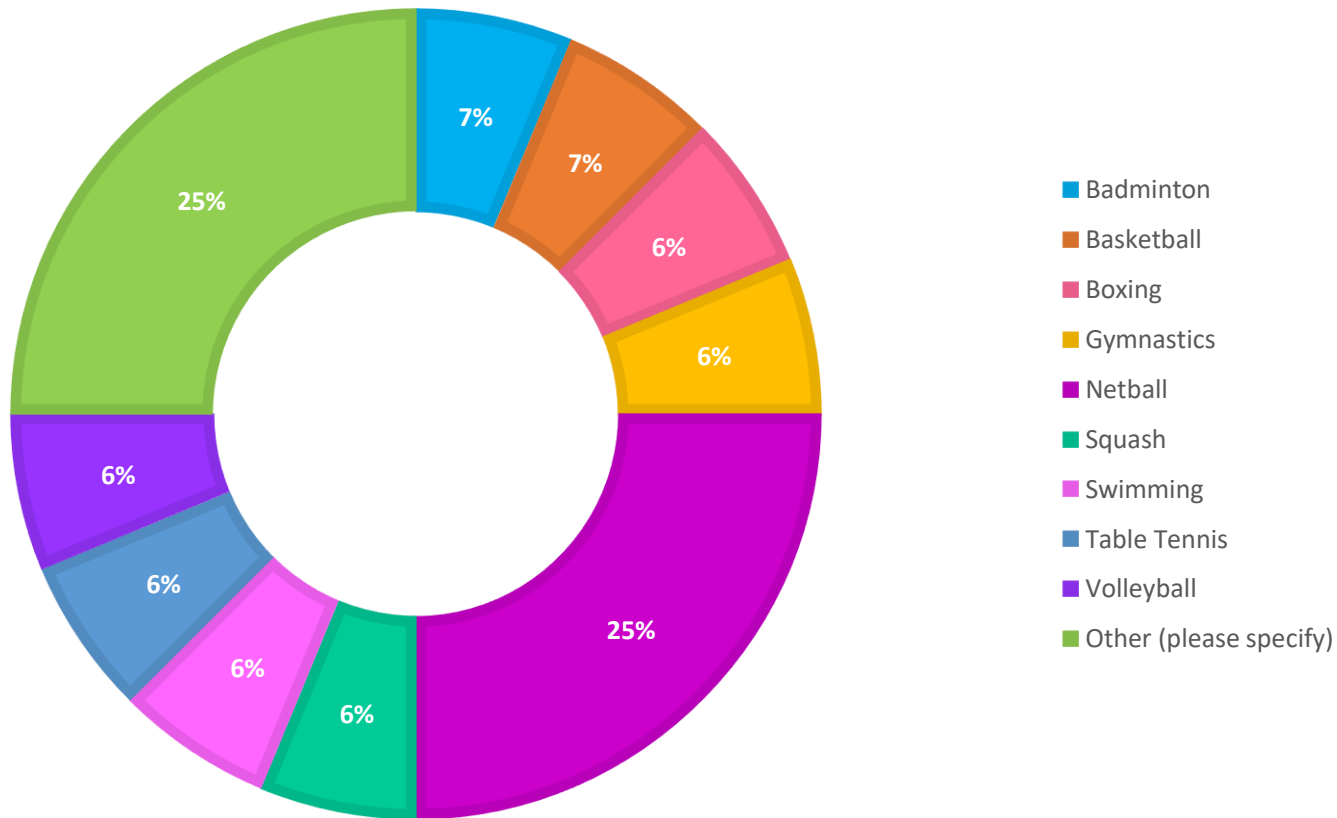

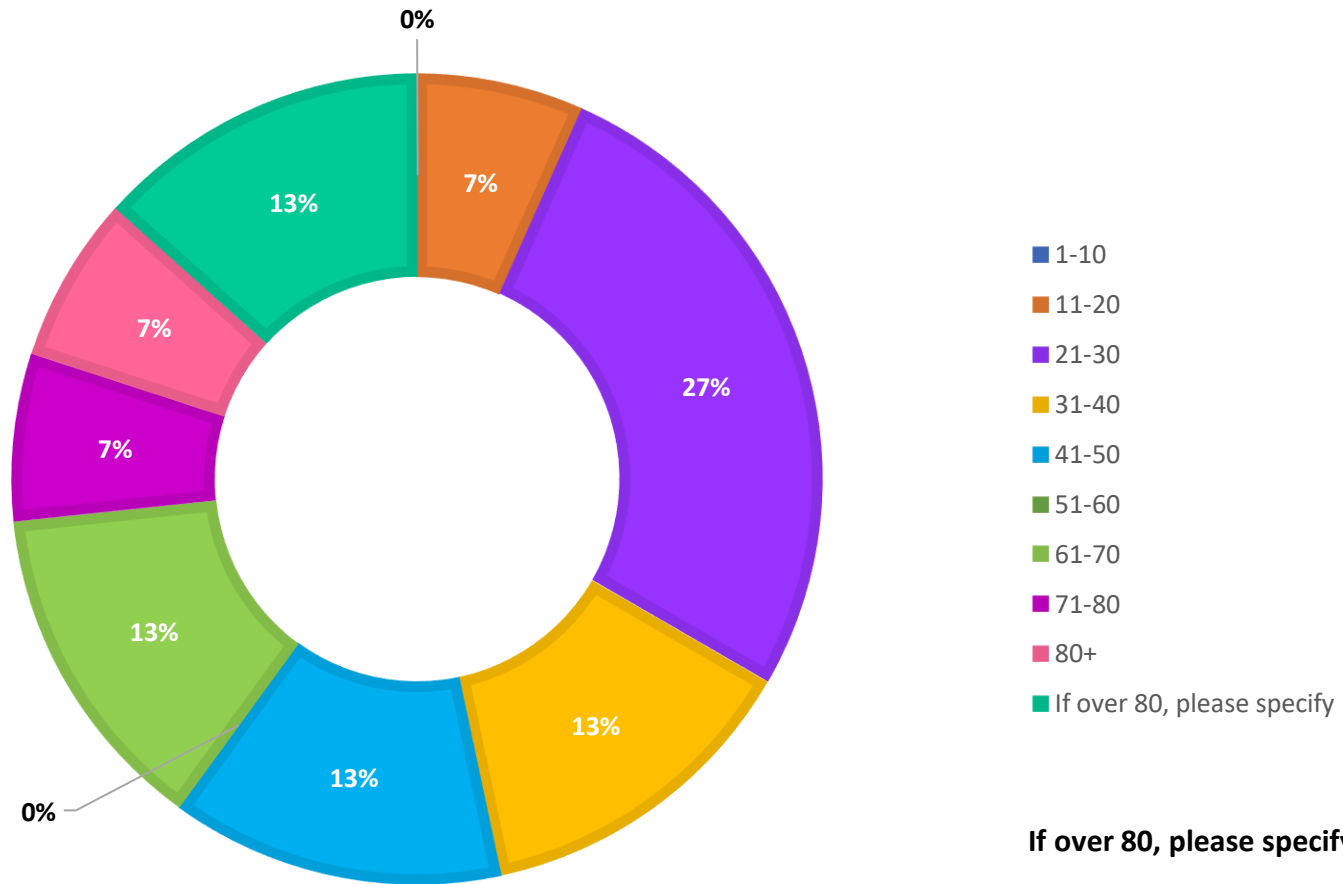

Please tick below the number of active playing members in your club



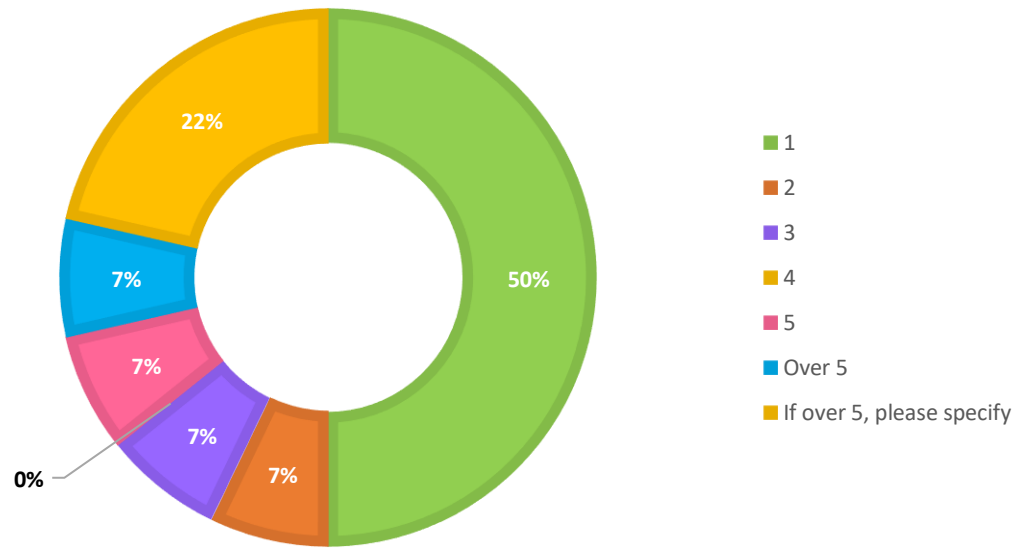

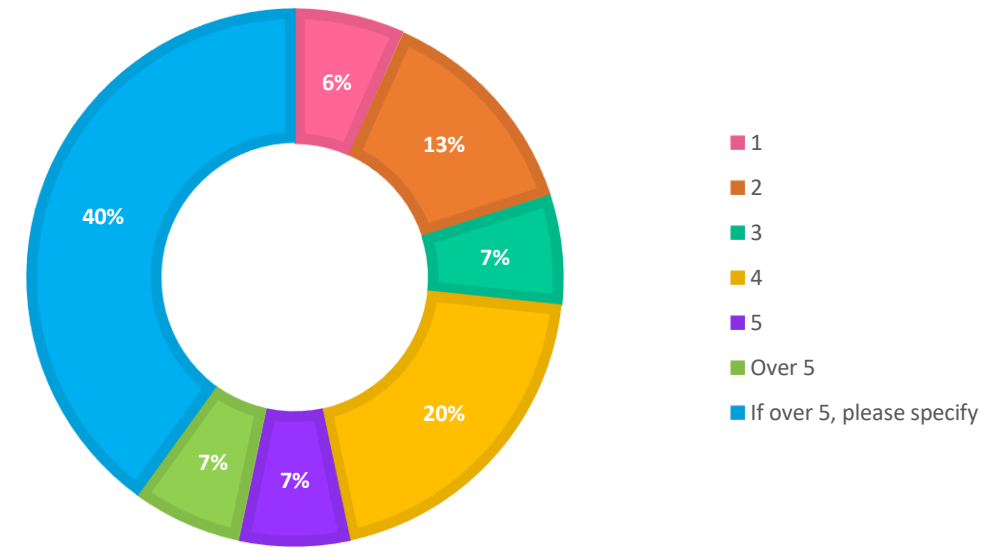

Please choose the number of volunteers in your club



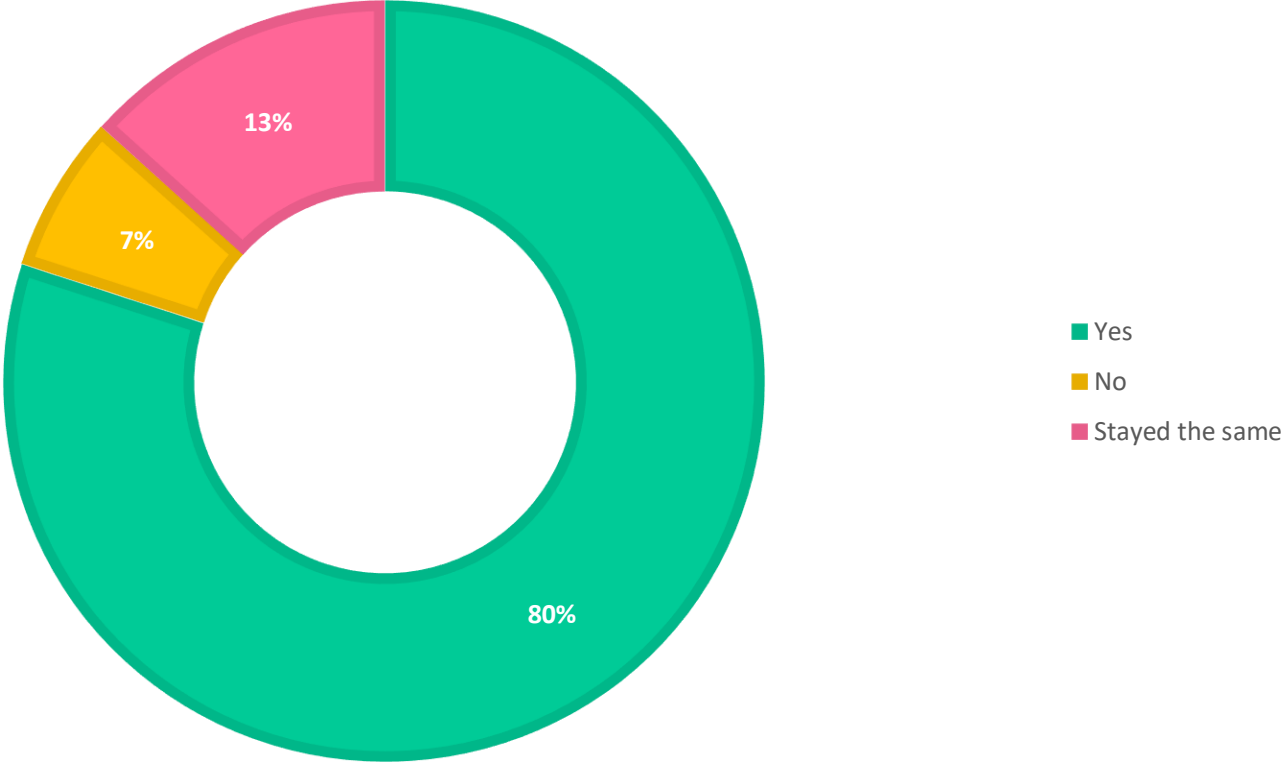

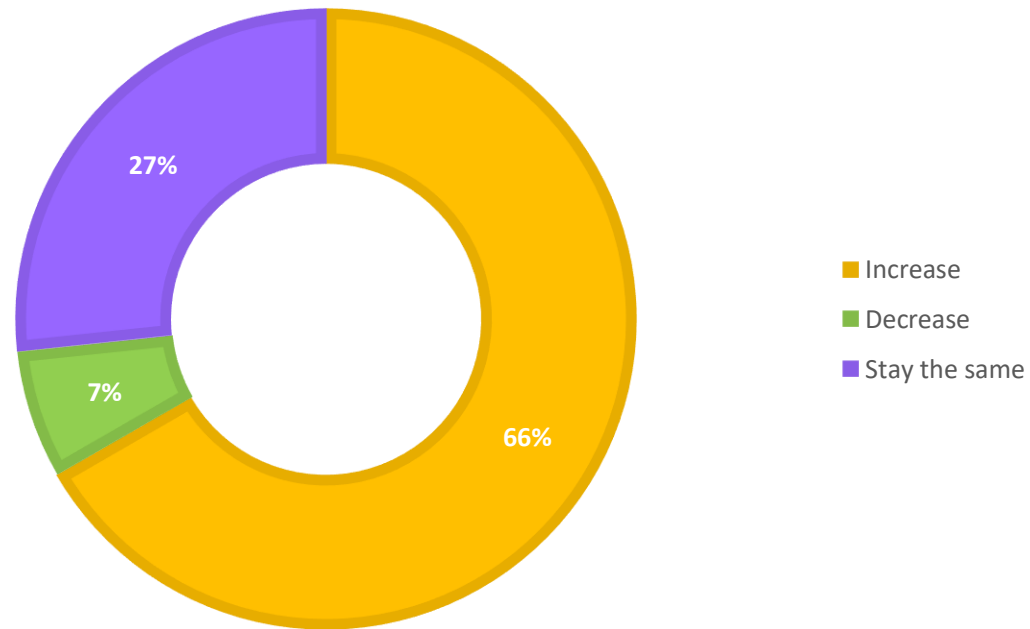
Has the number of playing members increased over the last 5 years?

Is the number of club members likely to increase/decrease over the next 5 years?



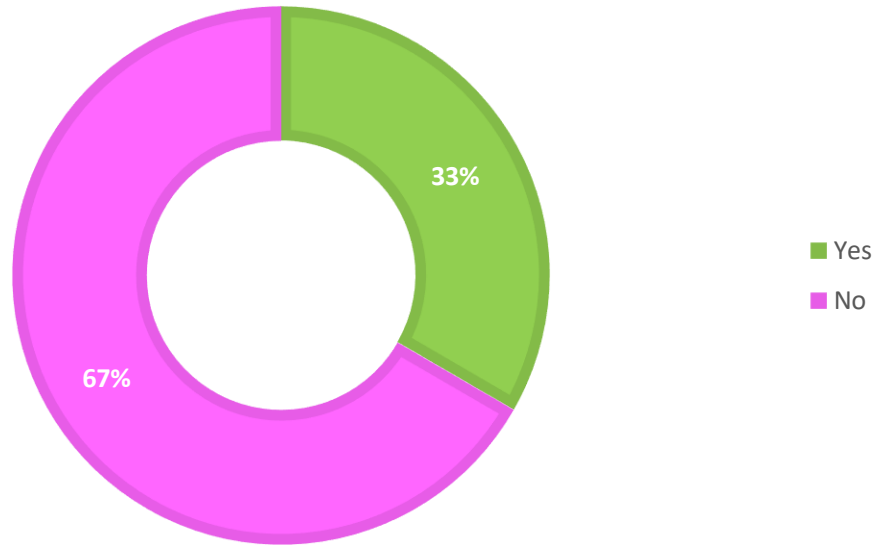
Please give the reason for the increase / decrease:

- Netball is the number one most popular team sport for girls and women in the UK and is becoming more popular since England won the 2018 Commonwealth Games gold and England hosted and won bronze in the 2019 Netball World Cup.
- Our regular membership has roughly stayed the same. We also have members that come every now and then. We do get quite a few enquiries from potential new members, sometimes through word of mouth or our website. We are the only club locally that offers a swim for disabled people.
- Improved club infrastructure to be able to accommodate more teams
- Hopefully increase as word spreads
- Slight increase due to players leaving, retiring, more local, pregnancies and new players joining the club
- We are at capacity in terms of adult and junior members in order to ensure a safe environment for training/playing and the ratio of volunteers/ coaches is adequate
- loss of interest in Badminton and not being played amid younger generations has been main underlying issue
- As our club grows with awareness, word of mouth, social media promotional videos; our numbers are growing with new members all the time
- Hopefully dependent on ability to recruit additional volunteers and access to an additional court
- Growth and increase in sessions available and coaches available to teach sessions
- more clients will attend due to more referrals within the NHS
- We run more beginners courses than most other local clubs

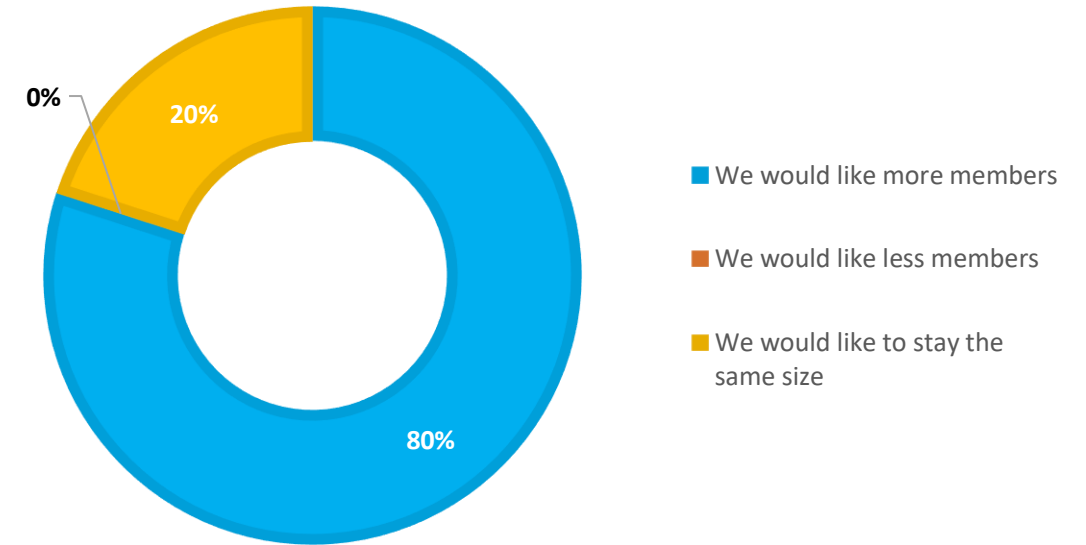

Is your club currently at full member capacity based on your current facility size?



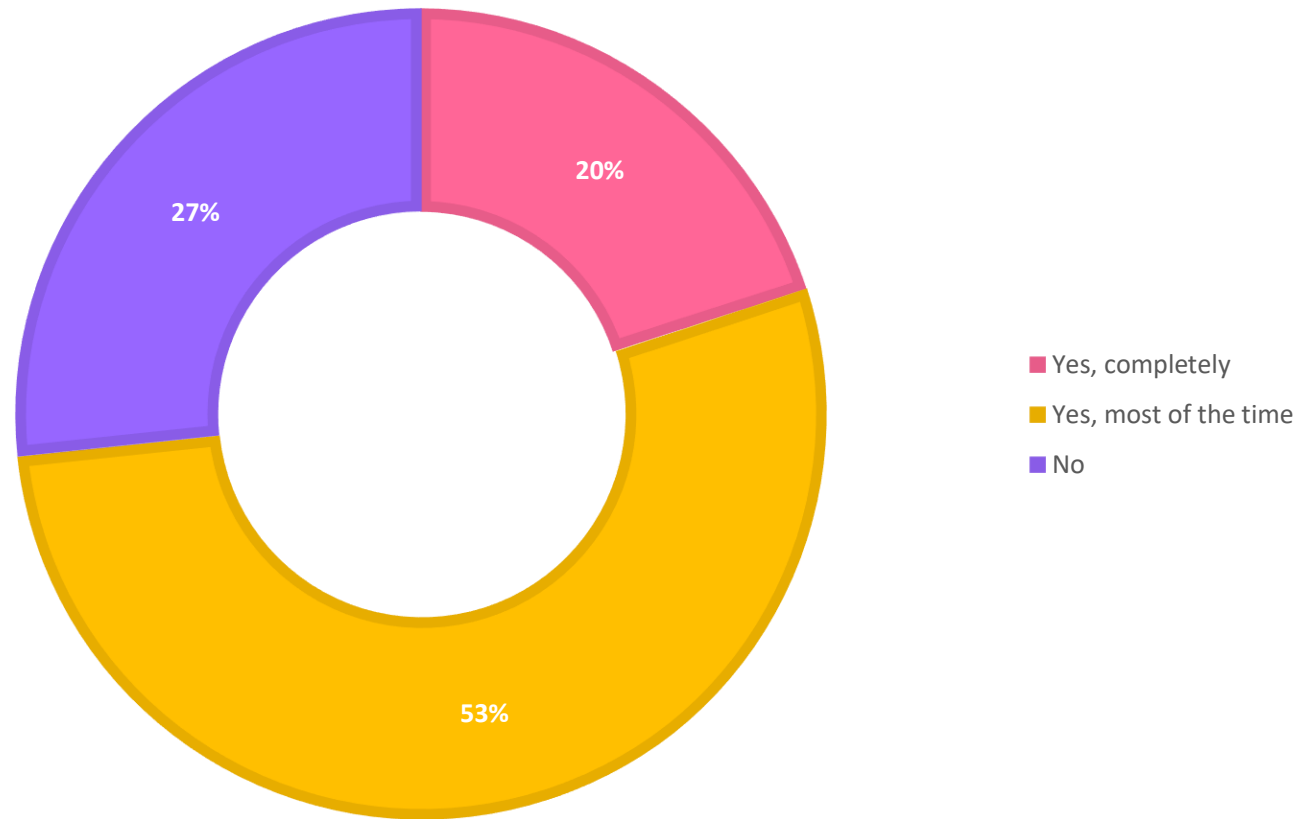
Moving Forward, would your club like more members?

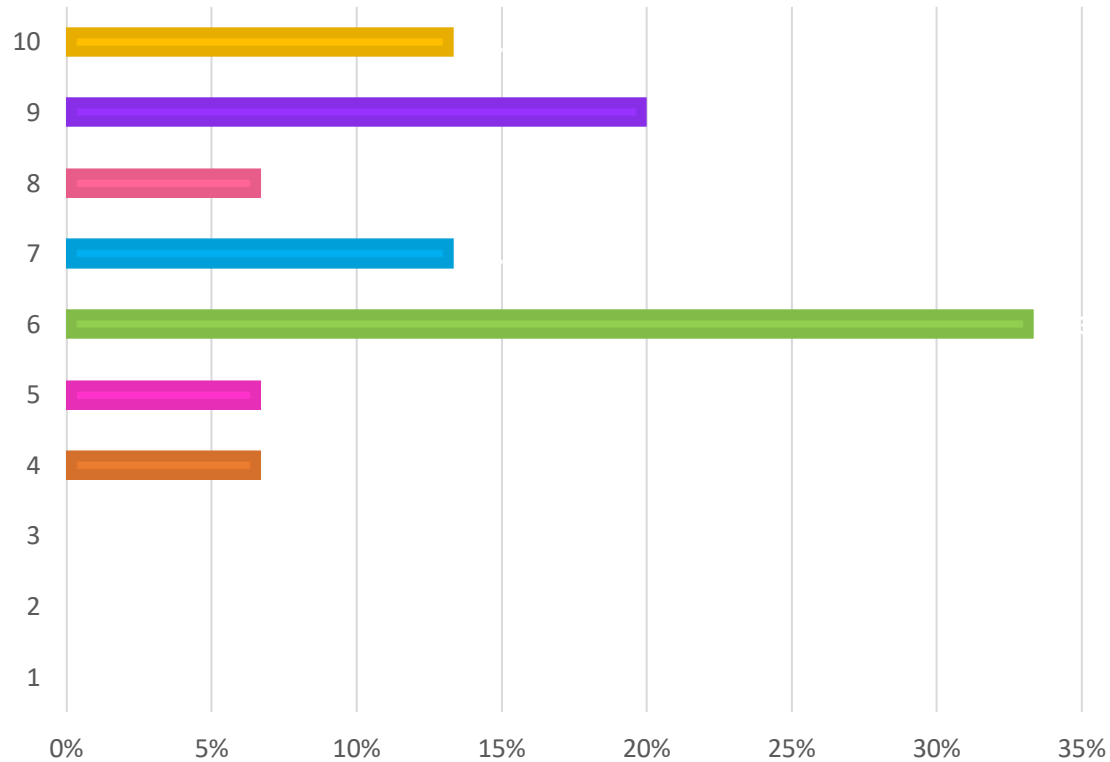
Does the facility you identify in Q3 fully suit your club's needs?

How could this facility be improved to suit your club's needs?

- "Better maintenance and quality of equipment.
- Disabled access to outdoor courts.
- This facility is part managed by the school and part managed by the sports centre so it is very difficult and timely for things to be done – i.e. equipment/facility repair/updating."

- More access time to the court to hold more sessions
- Bigger sports hall to accommodate 2 full volleyball courts. Better communication and planning for fixing exam times so we know when we can utilise the hall during the year.

- only main issue is the wall colours!! Hard to see the Shuttle against a cream backdrop. Had a few issues with the school closures (exam time historically we lose the venue for 6 weeks) and open evenings etc.
- We need a bigger venue to be able to meet the growing demand for our services with new members
- An additional netball court to accommodate juniors, more senior, also a walking netball club. Changing rooms, toilets washing facilities
- Day time access, more evening and weekend availability at affordable prices
- Have more evening to play. But as a social club the room is used every night for various other activities.
- Could do with another Studio/Function room
- "Mains electricity and mains water
- Provision of indoor shooting facilities"

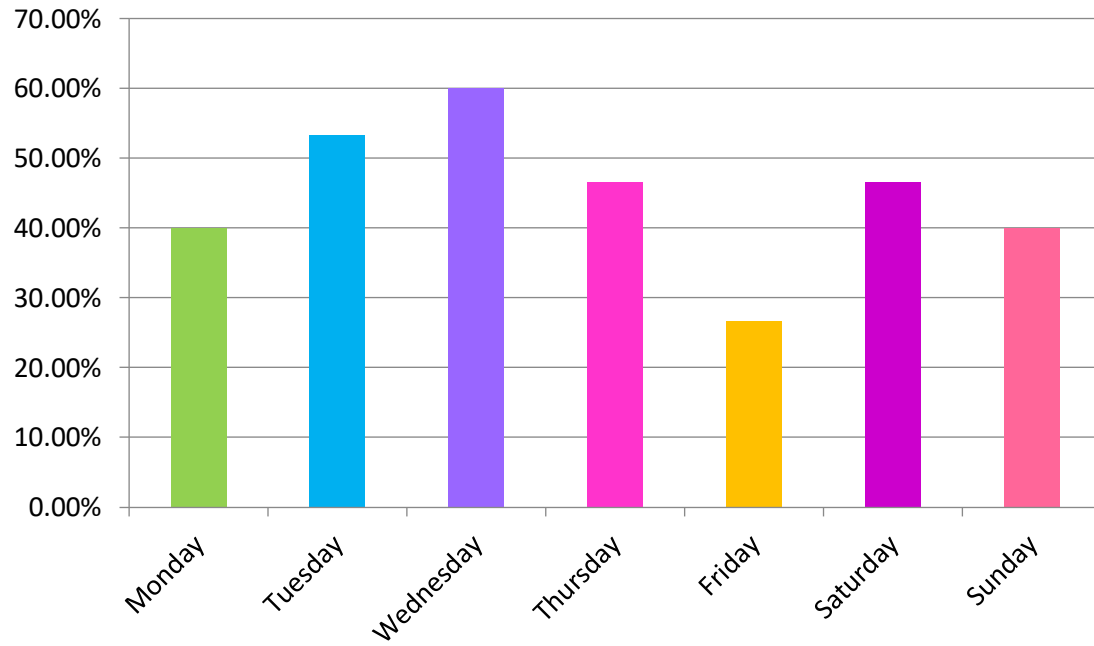

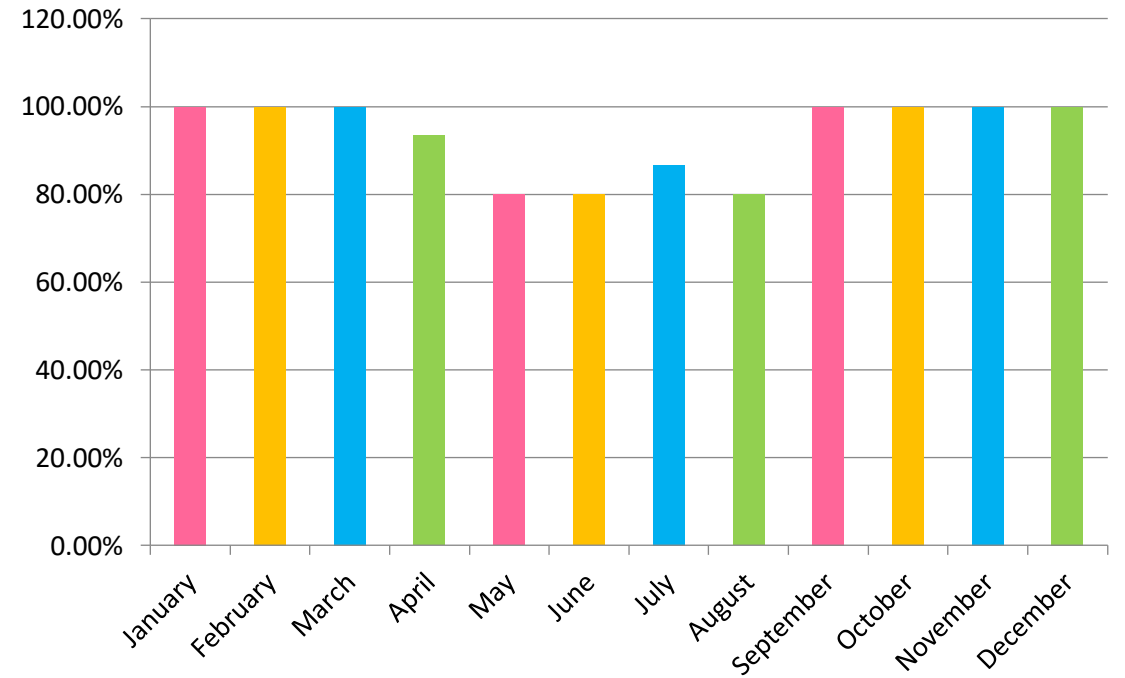
How many hours per week does your club use this facility?

Which days does your clubs use this facility?



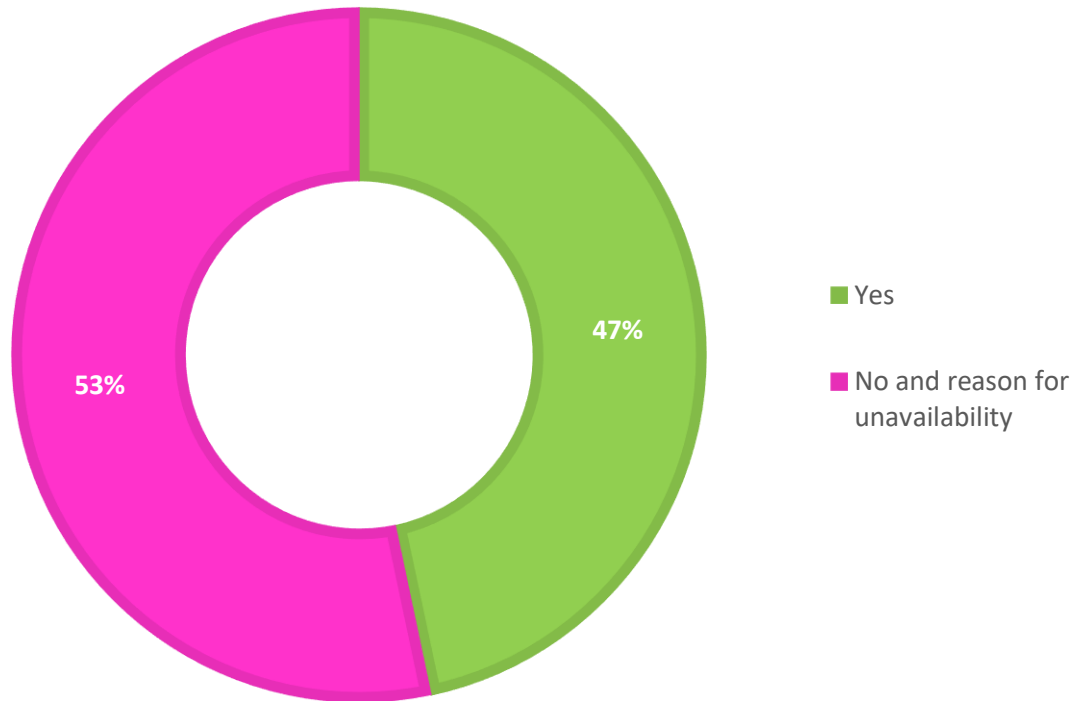
Please tick all months your club uses this facility

Is this facility accessible when you require? If not, what is the reason for unavailability?



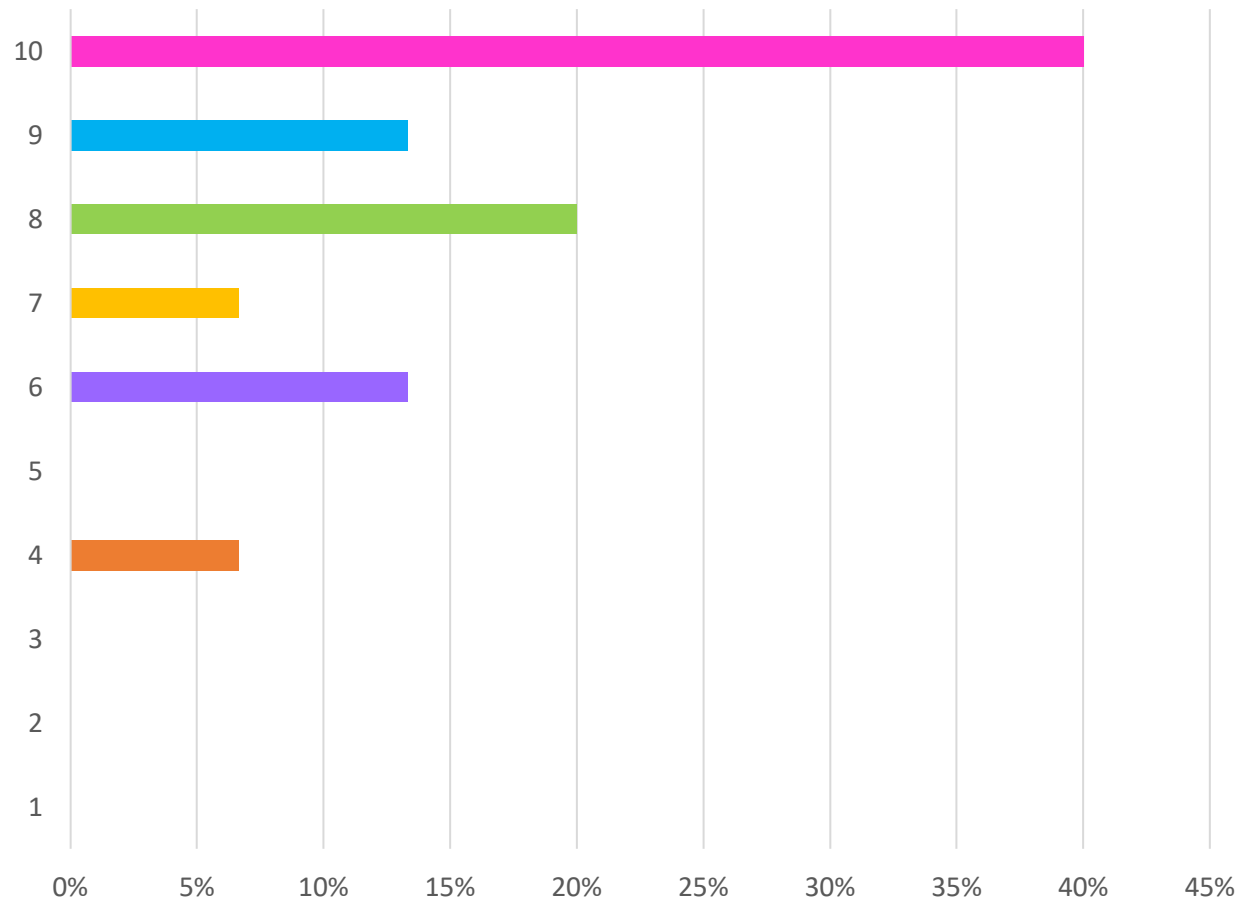
If not, what is the reason or unavailability?

- "To be able to keep running two teams in the Coventry and North Warwickshire Netball League and be successful with this.
- We have a low turn around of players with some seasons losing fewer players than other seasons. It is to recruit players that are of a standard to play in the league with out being seen to be ""poaching"" from other clubs which can sometimes cause a conflict. We run our club as professionally as we can and to date have a very good reputation in our community and our league and have great working relations with other clubs and friendships with their players.
- We would like to be able to gain players of a good standard from other avenues including the Monday night netball at the Pingles without ""trending on others toes"".
- It's always a fine balance to retain and gain players."

- We added created from a back to basics England Netball initiative. We trained for the first year inside a church hall and on a church carpark. We have used Nicholas Chamberlain school and Nuneaton academy for training and also games.
- We have been wanted to get a ground that We could call home.
- We were working with Bermuda Phoenix Centre, Nuneaton as it being a possibility of providing us with a ground.
- We have looked at the cost of creating a netball court, flood lights, netball storage and the cost was too high.
- We have had a number meetings with the manager of the club but unfortunately the cost was too great so we could not progress.
- Having a home ground that could cater for our clubs needs and the needs of the community would be beneficial to all involved."
- The ability to train and play on safe surfaces. We would love there to be more indoor training facilities available for netball. Training is difficult outside during winter months and not always well attended. I would like to see industrial units that aren't being used converted for use by local netball clubs. At the moment it's virtually impossible to get a slot in local facilities and even schools as they are all booked out by football and badminton. Maybe the council could get a grant for An indoor netball development centre to be built In a less wealthy postcode in town that could be used by all local clubs.
- serious increase in new members needed for club to survive. Membership has halved in last 10 years.
- greater capacity to deliver and income
- Access to funding to fund coaching qualifications, an additional court is desperately required. More committee members. Umpires. Recruitment of new players - seniors and juniors. Would like to accommodate mature seniors - walking netball club.
- purpose build facility and funding
- CoVID regulations to allow fitness activities to take part again.
- An affordable venue with plenty of access to be able to play.
- Indoor winter shooting is the biggest single issue as there is a severe shortage of suitable venues available and our current arrangement with the local school is now more difficult due to their rebuild of the school and loss of facilities
