

# **Duty to Cooperate Statement**

Gypsy and Traveller Site Allocations Development Plan Document (DPD)

Nuneaton and Bedworth Borough Council

June 2022

### 1.0 **INTRODUCTION**

- 1.1 This document is the 'Duty to Cooperate Statement' for the Gypsy and Traveller Site Allocations Development Plan Document (DPD). This statement sets out how the Borough Council has complied with the Duty to Cooperate to produce this DPD throughout the process. The duty to cooperate was created in the Localism Act 2011, and places a legal duty on the Borough Council, as the Local Planning Authority, to engage constructively, actively and on an ongoing basis on strategic cross boundary matters with specific bodies.
- 1.2 Nuneaton and Bedworth border the following Local Authorities:
  - North Warwickshire Borough Council
  - Rugby Borough Council
  - Coventry City Council
  - Hinckley and Bosworth Borough Council

## 2.0 COOPERATION

- 2.1 Nuneaton and Bedworth Borough Council (NBBC) operates within a two-tier system with Warwickshire County Council (WCC), who are responsible for education, highways, transport planning, minerals, social care, waste disposal, libraries and also a County owned and managed Gypsy site within the Borough. The Council have therefore worked closely with the County Council in developing the DPD.
- 2.2 NBBC is a non-constituent member of the West Midlands Combined Authority; as well as being part of Coventry and Warwickshire Local Enterprise Partnership (CWLEP); Coventry, Warwickshire and Hinckley & Bosworth Joint Committee for Economic Growth and Prosperity; Coventry; Warwickshire Chief Executives/Managers; Planning and Duty to Cooperate Group and Coventry, Solihull and Warwickshire Association of Planning Officers (CSWAPO). This involves carrying out combined evidence bases which includes a current update joint Strategic Flood Risk Assessment Level 1 and joint Housing and Economic Development Needs Assessment (HEDNA and other shared evidence bases. All matters including Gypsy and Traveller requirements are also discussed.

- 2.3 Work on the Gypsy and Traveller Site Allocations DPD began in 2020 with the first stage being the updating of the Gypsy, Traveller, and Travelling Showpersons Accommodation Assessment (GTAA). Prior to the commissioning of this work, the Borough Council engaged with all adjoining Local Planning Authorities in September 2020 (see appendix A attached) to ascertain if there was any desire to work together on an update to the GTAA and address need collectively. Two of the Authorities did not respond and two responded but did not wish to participate in a joint assessment; thus, a GTAA covering just Nuneaton and Bedworth was undertaken.
- 2.4 As part of the work on the GTAA the engaged consultants approached adjoining Authorities in January 2021 with a questionnaire to assist in the production of the new assessment. Paragraph 3.9 of the GTAA confirms that "*Stakeholders included representatives from all of the neighbouring local authorities, who were requested to provide information regarding their local situation and provision, including issues such as unauthorised encampment activity.*" Feedback received from neighbouring Authorities is set out in paragraphs 5.22 to and 5.26 of the GTAA. (See supporting documents; appendices 4, 5 and 6).
- 2.5 The Issues and Options version of the Gypsy and Traveller Site Allocations DPD was approved for public consultation by the Council's Cabinet on 26<sup>th</sup> May 2021. (See supporting document appendix 23). A public consultation was held from the 11<sup>th</sup> of June 2021 to the 6<sup>th</sup> of August 2021. All prescribed bodies required by the Localism Act 2011 to be engaged with were notified of the consultation as well as adjoining local Planning Authorities and WCC. Responses received on the Issues and Options version are set out in the separate Consultation Statement document. (See supporting documents appendices 25 and 26). The prescribed bodies for Nuneaton and Bedworth are as follows:

- Warwickshire Local Nature Partnership.
- 2.6 Following the closure of the Issues and Options the Borough Council ran a 'Call for Sites' between the 17<sup>th</sup> of September 2021 to the 22<sup>nd</sup> of October 2021. As a result of this combined with the GTAA from 2021, and responses received during the Issues and Options consultation, the Borough Council accrued a small number of sites which could accommodate additional gypsy and traveller pitches. An informal consultation on these sites with key stakeholders (many of which are required to be engaged under the Duty to Cooperate) ran in November 2021. (See supporting documents appendix 28 for the emails sent and the subsequent responses.) (Details are also provided in 5.0 Appendices 1 of the separate Site Assessments and the Green Belt document (Publication consultation draft).(See supporting document appendix 11.)
- 2.7 The publication version of the Gypsy and Traveller Site Allocations DPD was the next stage which was consulted upon between the 28<sup>th</sup> of January 2022 and the 25<sup>th</sup> of March 2022. This included contacting the adjacent local Planning Authorities and WCC as well as the bulleted prescribed bodies in paragraph 2.5. (See the relevant details in the supporting documents appendices 31 and 32.)
- 2.8 Of the adjoining Local Authorities only North Warwickshire Borough Council responded with specific comments and the rest of the neighbouring Local

Authorities failed to respond. WCC simply responded to advise they had consulted the separate relevant teams and confirmed they had no responses. (Responses to the Publication version and NBBC Officer comments are documented fully at the end of the supporting document appendix 35.)

2.9 Where it was considered that responders comments needed clarifying or where responses were not received and needed chasing; this was carried out on an individual basis in April 2022. (See supporting document appendix 38).

### 3.0 CONCLUSION

3.1 In conclusion, it is considered that NBBC has complied with the duty to cooperate with neighbouring Local Authorities and with WCC.
